Democracy


This is about making decisions together. Children are actively encouraged to express their opinions and values.

At High Flyers you will see;

Children making their own choices from snacks to activities to play
We let children initiate their own play and activities, alongside adult led activities too.
Children playing group 'team' games, listening to each other and working together.
Children offering ideas we use in our planning and voting for things.

Individual Liberty

Encouraging children to have a positive view of themselves and celebrating differences.



At High Flyers you will see;

Independence being promoted - Children choose their individual play, we provide play opportunities each session but they are free to make the choices about what they do.
Individual ideas being encouraged - We build on the suggestions the children give and act on them, like meal suggestions.
Respect being modelled and shown between children and adults.
A safe environment for children to explore and create. Risk assessments are made for activities so that play involving creating outdoor shelters, water play or cooking can be promoted and enjoyed in a safe environment.



Rule of Law

Children understanding the need for, and for following social rules and expectations.

At High Flyers you will see;

We have group agreements that we all talk about and agree on. Rules & safety procedures explained so that the children understand the reasons behind the rules and what the consequences could be if they were not followed.

Rules and systems are reviewed with the children at the beginning of each term.

Positive reinforcement and praise including a Star of the week awarded in the school Sharing Assembly and included in the weekly school newsletter.

Us supporting children in ways to deal with their emotions. We ensure children who need one to one time during a session are able to receive this. A few moments to support them in solving a problem, to share an idea, to boost their self-esteem impacts hugely on their emotional development.
